



A word from Assistant Community Spiritual Director Dan Jassman

"This is what the Lord says—he who made a way through the sea, a path through the mighty waters, who drew out chariots and horses, the army and reinforcements together, and they lay there, never to rise again, extinguished, snuffed out like a wick: 'Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland" (Isaiah 43:16-19, NIV).

This passage fascinates me. God says, 'Look what I did' only to turn around and say 'forget it.' Is God being fickle or playing tricks with our minds? Or perhaps is God simply telling us to remember the past, but not get stuck there?

When my family was called to start a new church here in Bloomington called Network I had some misgivings. I did not doubt God, but whether or not God would use someone like me for this undertaking. Some days I was excited, other days frustrated and discouraged. Had I misunderstood the call?

I remember one day God brought to mind an incident from our past. The transmission on the van went out on the way home from a mission trip at 9 p.m. on a Friday night. My first thought was, 'We are stuck until at least Monday.' As it turns out within 30-60 minutes we had a mechanic who went to work right away, a place to stay the night (for free!), chauffer service around town the next day, and the mechanic brought our van back to us Saturday night around midnight so we could get back on the road, only charging us \$1000 and having worked through the night Friday and all day Saturday. We have told of how God provided numerous times.

Then it hit me. I don't want my faith to be limited to the past, only fed by it. The same could be said of the Emmaus/Great Banquet community. We are coming up on our 100th weekend. God has worked in some marvelous and awesome ways and we enjoy looking back and telling the stories, but are we continuing to trust God with the present and future? Changes lay ahead. Such is life. But when they come we are always confronted with whether or not we will clinch to what has been or trust God to take us some place new.

Remember, but not to recreate; remember to feed your faith and build your trust in a God who continues to do "a new thing."
