Explain what the Great Banquet is: The Great Banquet is a three-day (7:00pm Thursday – 7:00 pm Sunday) spiritual retreat weekend of renewal, learning, and sharing in the atmosphere of a Christian community

This weekend experience is for anyone who:

- 1. Wishes to strengthen his/her spiritual life;
- 2. Wants to have a better understanding of prayer, study, and Christian action;
- 3. Strives to live a Christian life that bears fruit for God;
- 4. Seeks to know Jesus as Lord and Savior and to make Him known

Consider: making pillow agape which can be left with the Agape Chapel on Thursday night or signing up to serve a meal

Act:

- Help your guest complete the registration form
- Fill out your part of the form, and email it to the registrar
- Make transportation arrangements to and from the camp
- Assist your guest with registration and mingling on Thursday evening
- Collect agape letters and ensure they are at the camp by Saturday evening (see next page for a sample)

Attend: Sponsor's hour Thursday night at 8:00 pm; Apostolic Hour on Saturday at 8:30 pm followed by Candlelight; Fourth day meeting with your guest

<u>Cost:</u> The cost of meals, lodging, and supplies for the weekend is \$200/person. Payment for the full \$200 is not required, however, we do appreciate any donation you can give to help cover the costs. No guest will be prevented from attending a weekend based on ability to pay.
